## LIONS INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER CONTEST

At the November 5, 2025 Claymont Lions Dinner Meeting, members reviewed and voted on two entries submitted for this year's Lions International Peace Poster Contest. The theme for 2025 is "Together As One." Under the guidance of Talley Middle School art teacher Ms. Julie Navickas, who has supported students in this program for several years, two exceptional posters were created. Adrienne Chapman, a 7th grader, was named Runner-Up, and 8th grader Samantha DuRoss was selected as the Claymont Lions Club winner.

In addition to the **\$100 prize** awarded by the Claymont Lions Club, Samantha will also receive a cash award from the district for her recent victory.

We are extremely proud of Samantha and know her school and community are as well. The Peace Poster presentation is anticipated for our first dinner meeting on **January 14, 2026**.

### **NOVEMBER 19<sup>th</sup> DINNER MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

Our guest speaker at the November 19<sup>th</sup> dinner meeting was Ms. Hannah Cesner of Zoe Ministries, Inc. Zoe Ministries is a Delaware-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit dedicated to supporting girls affected by or at risk of sex trafficking. Their work includes community education, prevention programs, and trauma-informed services for survivors. Zoe Ministries is also developing "Hannah's House," a long-term residential therapeutic home for female minors ages 12–17, which will be the first of its kind in Delaware.

Hannah delivered a thought-provoking presentation on human trafficking in Delaware, including key information about state laws and current legislation.

Another highlight of the evening was welcoming our newest member, Jacqueline Haymen-Carter! She was proudly sponsored by Lion Nolan Lewis, and we are excited to have her energy and enthusiasm added to our club. Lion Haymen-Carter was inducted by PCC Don Lion LeCates.

## CHRISTMAS TREE SALE



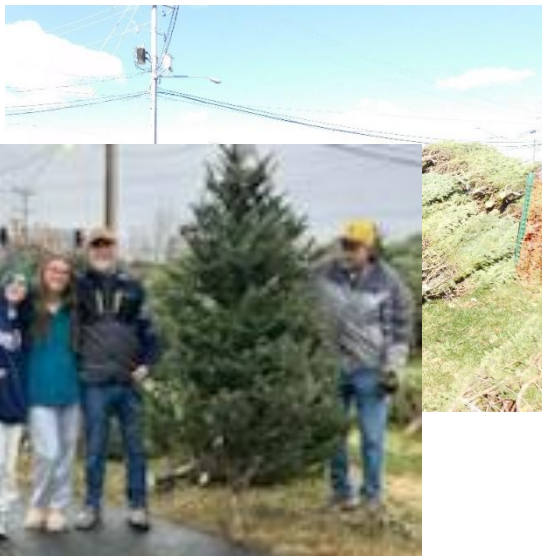
